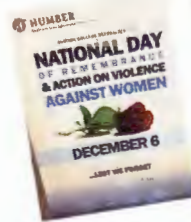


Halloween

Final Exams: Students Relax on Campus

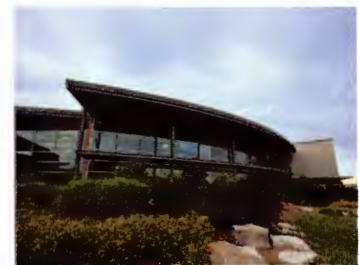

in April and was starting classes at Guelph-Humber in May. Our cohort of 70 students went through a challenging summer semester where they caught us up to the degree students so we could enter third year with the same knowledge.

It was a difficult summer, but we all came out of it with so much new information to put to use in the program. I've made lots of new connections and learned that even if you come from a small town, new friendships and opportunities are everywhere. It was a bit of a plunge to commit to another five semesters of school directly after finishing the diploma, but I would do it all again in a second because of the opportunities now available to me with both a diploma in fitness and a degree in Kinesiology.

What is a typical work day like for you?

I am in the Before and After School Kindergarten Program at YMCA. I open in the morning and welcome the children into the classroom. I prepare breakfast for the children and engage them in fun activities based off of the children's interests. I walk the children to their classrooms and help them get ready for their day at school. After school, the children come to the YMCA program where we have snacks and other fun activities to engage in before their families pick the children up at the end of the day.

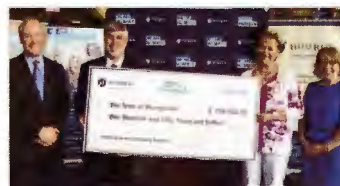
OPEN HOUSE

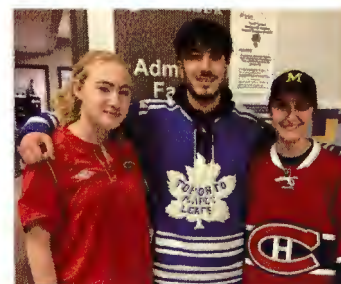
Amazing 2nd-year Early Childhood Education Advocacy project presentations were on display at the Humber Orangeville Campus. Students
