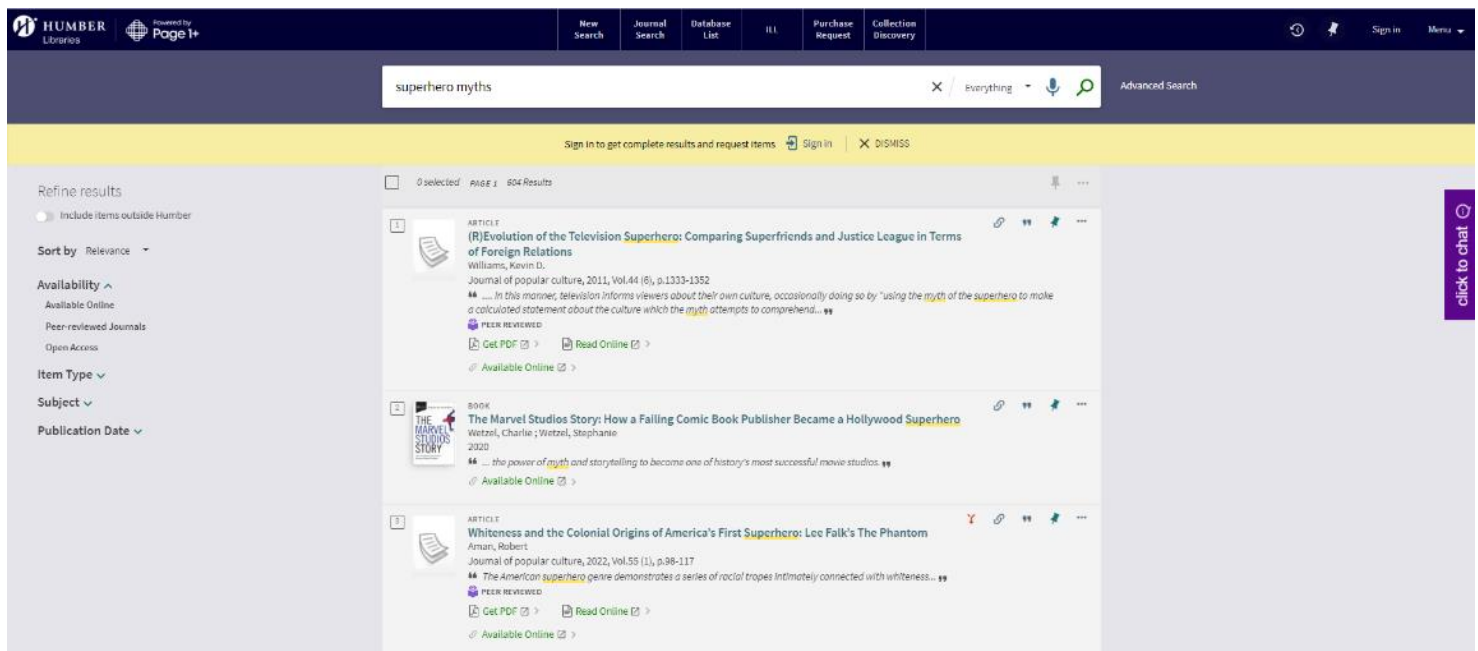
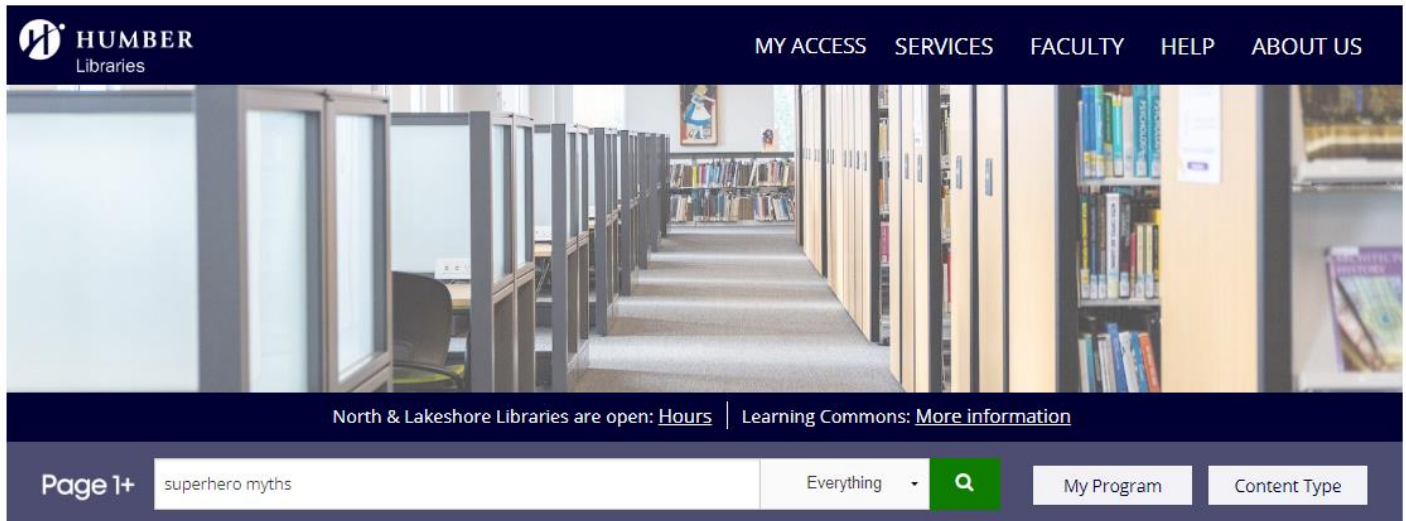
Humber Libraries, along with 19 other college libraries across the province, will be transitioning to Page 1+ on August 8.

Page 1+ is convenient.




